We serve 25,000 residents annually.

69% of residents are extremely low income, earning **30% or less** of the area median income.



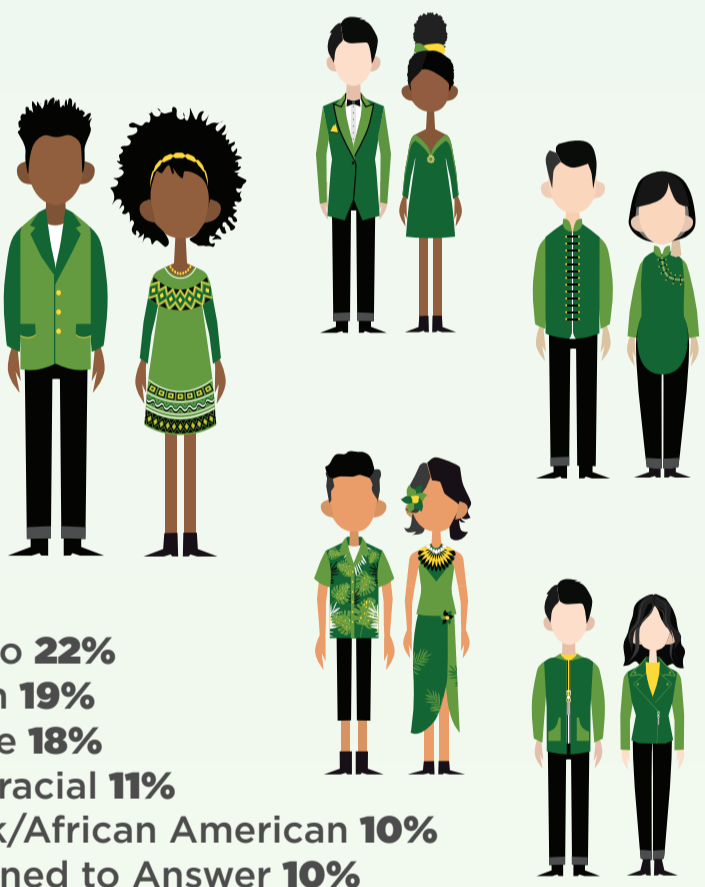

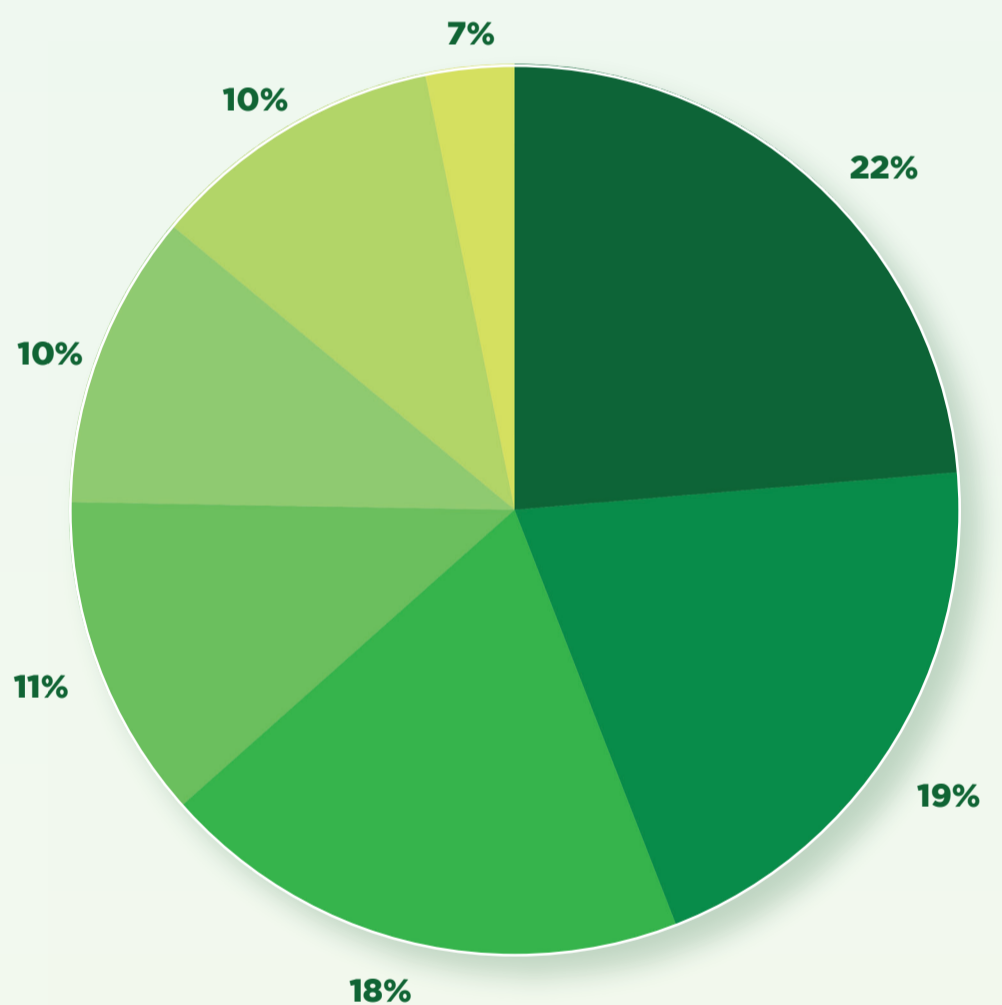

Ethnicities of Residents Served Across California and Hawai'i

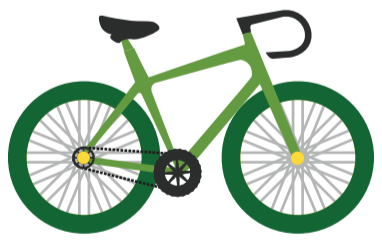

Through programs like StayWell!, digital literacy training, and scholarship opportunities, we empower residents to lead healthier lives while supporting their essential needs.



18,567 residents participated in **676 StayWell!** resident services programs.

Healthy Eating, Active Living, Community Building, Physical & Mental Health, and Civic Engagement

475 residents completed EAH Housing's digital literacy program



163,000 lbs. of food, valued at **\$266,000** was distributed to EAH Housing residents.



120 EAH Housing Scholarships have been awarded to residents since the program's creation in 2012. Each scholarship provides **\$2,500 per year for up to 5 years.**
